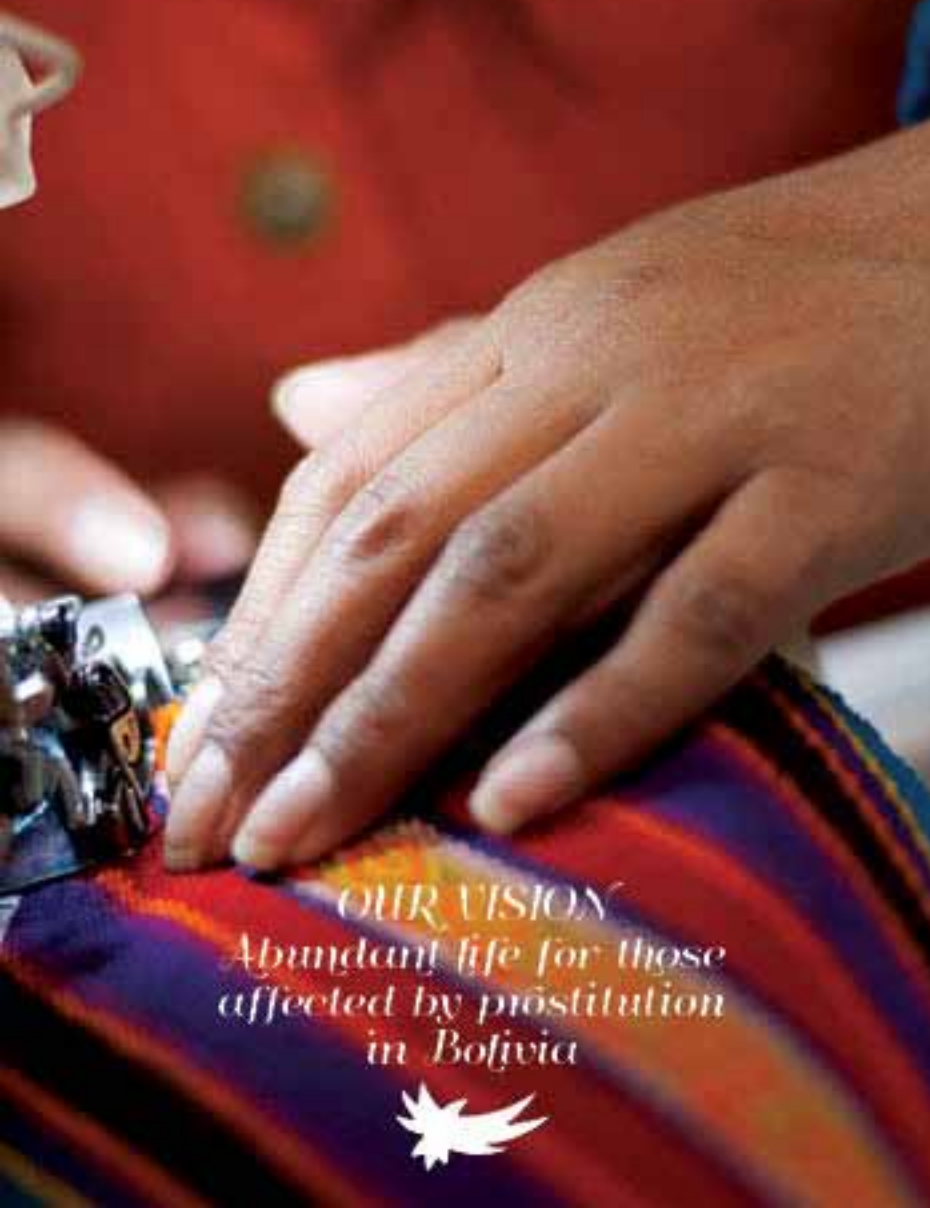

Letter from the director

In 2002, WMF Bolivia opened with a Mother's Day party in the red-light district, desiring to recognize women who prostitute, the majority of whom do so to support their children. Nearly 15 years later, we continue to walk alongside these vulnerable women and their children.

Although the realities of poverty and violence have not changed much, our seeds of slow, consistent service have borne signs of abundant life in every realm of the ministry.

This year, our social enterprise SutiSana floundered under financial pressure, but a stream of sacrificial giving has brought miraculous stability. A kidnapped child inexplicably returned home. Whole families committed their lives to following Christ. Churches, news outlets and financial institutions pursued us for partnership. And believers from all over the world united in powerful and strategic intercessory prayer.

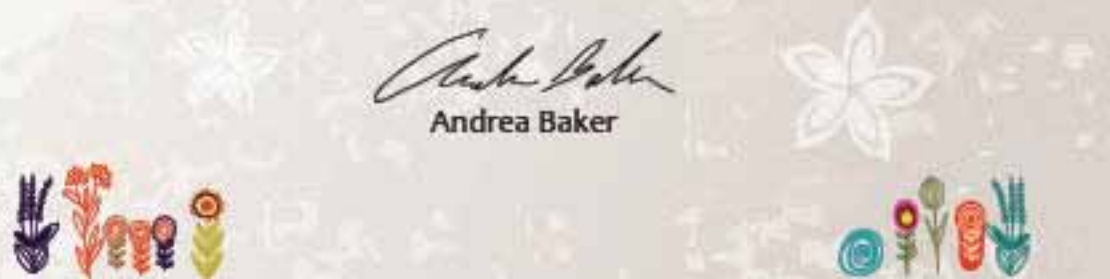
This is the beautiful work of the whole church, unified in prayer, strategic partnership and sacrificial service.

A visitor recently teased me, "She thinks she can change the world!" And it's true. Every day we see glimpses of glory; together, we are changing the world one life, one day at a time. Fiona* was serving soup in the bus terminal, lugging around steaming pots taller than her waist. She had left the brothels only a few weeks prior, pregnant with her fifth child. Lifting another massive pot, she felt a sharp stab in her belly. Fiona feared a miscarriage if she couldn't find another job, and the next day she came to the ministry center begging for work.

Staff at SutiSana, the WMF Bolivia social enterprise, noted the fire and desperation in her eyes and showed her to a sewing machine. Five months later, she gave birth to a healthy boy.

Fiona wasn't content with merely learning to sew. She now shows the same perseverance in therapy and family economics classes, as in her growing relationship with the Lord. Fiona even enrolled in night school, determined to turn her third grade education into a high school diploma.

At WMF Bolivia, we're committed to working for abundant life for all those affected by prostitution. For Fiona, our star seamstress, as she tirelessly fights for her sister's orphaned children while continuing to care for her own; for those same children as they battle their own demons; and for each woman, man and child on the journey towards the fullness that Christ offers.
