

WMF Moldova builds community among the vulnerable and the marginalized children and their families. We create a space of respect and hope, offering opportunities for holistic healing through practical activities that contribute to their rehabilitation and integration into society.


The current political and economic crisis due to the pandemic and now the war in neighboring Ukraine, have exacerbated the challenges for families already affected by poverty. Alcoholism and domestic abuse are an ongoing problem; anxiety and depression have increased; basic food and housing security is a serious challenge as Moldova faces high inflation rates and wages that can not keep up with rising costs.

WMF Moldova responds to children vulnerable to running away from home, vulnerable to dropping out of school, and vulnerable to social marginalization and ethnic discrimination. WMF Moldova supports them and their families through tutoring, speech therapy, access to computers and internet, literacy for mothers, assistance in finding employment, food packages, and assistance with utility bills. Bible stories, worship, and prayer are embedded into the weekly rhythms with the kids.



Volunteer Spotlight

Valerie Sherbert's gap year in Chişinău, Moldova was a time of profound transformation and spiritual growth as she volunteered with Word Made Flesh Moldova. During this period, she experienced the challenges of separation, healing, the joy of new friendships, and a sense of family. Through her volunteer work, Valerie discovered the impact of simple gestures, like smiles and hugs, in building connections that transcended language barriers. Valerie's story reflects a profound gratitude and a strengthened resolve to trust in God's plan, as she learned to appreciate the lessons and blessings that unfolded during her time with the Word Made Flesh Moldova community.



HOW DID YOUR EXPERIENCE IMPACT YOUR WALK WITH GOD?

This year was my gap year. A year of the struggle of separation and the healing of old wounds, the finding of new friends, and the connection of found family. God showed me, very clearly, that He was there through it all, carrying me when I felt like I couldn't walk anymore and teaching me to run.

Through my gap year in Moldova, God has shown me more of His love and Glory, taking me places He knew would resonate deeply with me and sending me people who taught me things I had never thought of before. This last year has brought together many of the points God has been making throughout my whole life, wrapped up and set in front of me, waiting for me to open, and finally letting His words click; and they did. He helped me to realize so many of the things He's been teaching me and preparing me for. For that and more, I am forever grateful. God had been with me, watching me, and caring for me through it all. This year has strengthened my resolve to give my life to Him.

WHAT DID YOU LEARN ABOUT YOURSELF THROUGH HELPING THE KIDS?

Despite not being able to speak the same language, one thing I learned was just how far a smile and a hug can go, how important just sitting with someone can be, and how much laughter a simple card game can bring. It's the simple things that build up to happiness, and the even simpler things that really show someone that you love them. God works like that, too, in many ways, and I've also learned how much we overlook the little (but many) things He does. We need to work harder to notice Him and thank Him. He added to the world the slight rustling of the leaves in the trees, the miniscule yet extravagant detailing on a singular snowflake, the small sparkle in someone's eye when they feel joy, and so much more. How much more is His love for us than we realize, if He even thought deeply about a fleeting raindrop on a hidden leaf? And how much more can we trust Him knowing how much He cares for a singular sparrow? He showed me this; how much closer I need to look.

God was there, and still is, orchestrating and leading us where we need to go, and all we need to do is trust Him. Through all the doubt, sorrow, and hardships, it's all for Him; always was and always will be.

WHAT WAS YOUR FAVORITE MEMORY?

I can't exactly pick one favorite memory. I've had so many experiences with so many wonderful people. From playing hide-and-go seek tag with Little Ionuţ to climbing the side of a mountain and exploring dark caves with new friends, I have loved every minute of the time I've spent with everyone. But, of all the wonderful memories I made, most of them were with my best friend, Paulina. She is the one who made my favorite memories my favorites.

WHAT WOULD YOU LIKE PEOPLE TO KNOW ABOUT THE MISSIONAL WORK OF THE WMF COMMUNITY?

The people I worked with at WMF Moldova and a local church partner are true and good. They want to share their love with not only with hurting children, but with adults too. They understand how much people might just need a smile. Their eyes are set on the care of the uncared for, the seeking of the lost, and the spreading of the hopeful, never-ending Gospel of Jesus.

Noella's Journey from Abandonment to Belonging

Noella is our friend from the Kinyinya neighborhood. She joined our weekly Bible study and savings group in September 2023, during a particularly challenging time in her life. Recently abandoned by her husband, she was pregnant and caring for a young son with no one else to support her. Despite these hardships, Noella was eager to connect with others and diligently learn the truth of God's word, holding onto the hope that her problems would be solved.

One day, after a lesson on our God-given identity and His love for humanity, Noella raised a prayer request. She shared that she had not been able to pay rent for several months, and her landlord was about to evict her. In an act of love and solidarity, every woman in the group gave up her one-time savings to pay for Noella's rent and buy her food and baby clothes.

Soon after, Noella gave birth. The ministry provided nourishing porridge to keep her and the baby healthy. Noella dreams of starting a small business for a regular income and is working hard to gather the capital to begin. Although she has not started the business yet because her baby is sick and too young for her to leave alone, we have witnessed God's work in the lives of the women we serve. Noella has become a cherished friend to them and to us.

In all this, we praise God that His love is at work in the lives of the women we serve. It is only through this love that communities can experience holistic transformation. Noella's journey is a testament to the power of community, faith, and the unwavering support that can emerge when we come together in the spirit of God's love.

WMF Sierra Leone responds to significant challenges in the Kroo Bay community, including drug addiction, poverty, exploitation, and abuse. Through their various programs, they work to bridge educational and relational gaps, offering opportunities to those who might otherwise be overlooked. Additionally, they address the lack of access to quality medical care by providing essential treatment and healthcare education.

Through offering people experiencing poverty in Kroo Bay relationships built on mutual vulnerability and trust, along with leadership training, and skills and traditional education, WMF Sierra Leone endeavours to spread God's light, hope, wisdom, and peace.

WMF Burundi, registered locally as Trauma Healing And Reconciliation Services (THARS), is comprised of psychosocial practitioners and peacemakers who contribute to healing and peacemaking in Burundi and the Great Lakes Region of Africa. We use a holistic approach to bring people from all walks of life to psychosocial healing and the resolution of differences. This new path to peace is based on the understanding that the seeds of tomorrow's wars grow in the soil of today's unhealed traumas. The seeds of tomorrow's peace grow in the soil of today's healing and reconciliation.

Emmanuel Nimubona, an 18-year-old orphan, once struggled daily with hunger, making it difficult for him to focus on his studies at Rutegama Fundamental School. Before the "Feeding for Hungry Children" program was introduced by THARS in 2016, Emmanuel's performance in school suffered. He said that before this program, when he came from school, tried to study, or even before school, it was very difficult for him to attend classes properly because of hunger. However, after receiving daily meals through the program, everything changed. Emmanuel's grades improved dramatically, and he was advanced to the next grade. Now, with newfound hope and determination, Emmanuel dreams of becoming a minister one day.

"The most impactful part of the internship was when we went to the brothels and saw first hand what happened there. We got to encourage the women and invite them to the center to grow in their skills and gain freedom from this type of work. It was really sad to see the environment that these women have to endure, but it made the reality of their situation so much more real for me. It increased my drive to help them and get them out of this type of situation. It is one thing to know what the conditions are, and it is another thing to see it first-hand. Overall, this experience has grown me spiritually in so many ways. One thing that really stood out to me through this experience was the sovereignty of God. I could see His hand all over my trip, and it was so cool to see how He provided for me and the people in Bolivia. It was amazing to see how God meets people where they are, no matter the culture, language, or understanding of Him."

Through their compassionate outreach, WMF Brazil introduces them to the hope and love of Jesus, while working to improve their quality of life offering a pathway to healing and restoration.

Word Made Flesh India seeks to love, serve, and accompany vulnerable children and women. We are dedicated to seeking out those who receive the least concern and assistance, loving the unloved, while affirming that the poor are rich in Christ and the rich are utterly poor apart from Him.

WMF India's Community Center prioritizes support through educational initiatives, healthcare, providing essential needs, and vocational training targeting children, youth, especially young women, and widows. Special attention is given to girls from highly marginalized backgrounds, including those affected by HIV or Hansen's disease, offering them educational support, higher education guidance, and counseling. The Community Center also empowers underprivileged girls and women, including orphans and widows from COVID-affected families, with vocational training in crafts such as soap making, mat weaving, and stitching to help them start their own businesses.

WMF Papua New Guinea empowers communities through literacy training and skill development, with strong legal advocacy through local partnerships. Specific projects include improving access to clean water and expanding medical care, which encompasses emergency services and utilizing local medical resources. The program also focuses on educating the villages about the signs and symptoms of common deadly diseases. Efforts also extend to organizing a Trauma Healing workshop in the village of Baku and advocating for a new medical clinic with provincial health authorities.

HEALING DIVIDES

"On our final week of training the literacy teams, we traveled from village to village to see the place where they would be teaching preschoolers and to speak with the community about their responsibility to support their local literacy teams. As we docked at the village of Mayo, my friend, Jessy, the literacy teams coordinator whispered aside to me, "I haven't set foot in this village in 13 years." This was the most dramatic but not the only instance of long standing divides being bridged and slowly healed through the choices of the 20 men and women who faithfully participated in the literacy training. I have been so deeply grateful to see the Holy Spirit at work in their lives and through them in the lives of their villages."

Word Made Flesh Navajoland partners with a church in Bodaway, Arizona, to share the Gospel of Christ among the Diné people by addressing both physical and spiritual needs. The ministry has organized vacation Bible schools during the summer, revival meetings, Christmas programs, and other supportive events throughout the year. Collaborating with local Navajo organizations and individuals, the ministry aims to alleviate the challenges of extreme poverty and unemployment while nurturing spiritual growth within the community. These efforts focus on building strong relationships, introducing Christ to the younger generation, providing essential resources like food and clothing, and offering job training opportunities. The commitment is to make a lasting impact on the Bodaway region by meeting both immediate and long-term needs.









LOOKING AHEAD

Hopes for 2024

In Eastern Europe, WMF Moldova hopes to increase its financial support, empower the new Administrator, and expand the team with additional staff. WMF Romania hopes to strengthen partnerships with local churches, celebrate volunteers, and address new community challenges through updated objectives.

In Africa, WMF Rwanda hopes to provide Bibles to women and children, hire a full-time local staff member, and conduct life skills trainings that transform lives. The aim is to deepen connections through weekly home visits and expand dignified employment for artisans to reach larger markets. WMF Sierra Leone hopes to build local partnerships, launch a 12-step addiction recovery program, and continue cherished events like Christmas parties and Princess Day. Plans also include initiating a BAM (Business as Mission) program and supporting staff sabbaticals. WMF Burundi plans to continue the nutrition program for Batwa children and trainings and counseling for psychosocial healing and reconciliation.

In Latin America, WMF Bolivia hopes to forge strategic connections at the Stott-Bediako forum, build partnerships with regional organizations, and facilitate internships with local partner organizations. WMF Brazil hopes to strengthen community unity, find a new location for the Ester Project, secure new financial sponsors, and encourage women's participation in volunteer activities.

In Asia and Oceania, WMF India hopes to partner with the local community to provide educational and livelihood training for children, teens, and women, ensuring they have the tools needed for a better future. WMF Papua New Guinea hopes to foster spiritual growth through Bible study and prayer, equip pastors to address community issues, and expand evangelical outreach.

In North America, WMF Navajo plans to involve 2 new cross cultural workers, host a Discovery Team, and facilitate special programs for children during the summer and holidays. The WMF International Office is focused on deepening connections and expanding impact through key initiatives. Goals include engaging four churches, five networks, and 100 supporters to foster stronger partnerships aligned with the mission. The office plans to recruit 30 short-term program participants from eight universities and one church, broadening its reach among emerging leaders. Additionally, plans include participating in the American Society of Missiology and Lausanne conferences, engaging 75% of the current donor base to express gratitude, gather perspectives, and strengthen commitment, and hosting three in-person fundraising gatherings. The office will also facilitate 360-degree evaluations with staff to promote continuous improvement and collaborative growth.
